My name is Allyson Mineau. I am a parent advocate out of Oceanside. I have been involved with parents and stakeholders over several years in the district and trying to make change for our school district.

The district has failed many students throughout several years under the leadership of Dr. superintendent Julie Vitale and current sitting school board members.
